

Reproduction of Jersey Postage Stamp Images - Guidelines

The following conditions apply to any stamp image reproduction:

1. The whole postage stamp image must be reproduced (including the word 'JERSEY', the perforations, the stamp value and the monarch's head).



2. The postage stamp image components (e.g. value, wording, painting/photograph, and monarch's head) may not be altered, removed or replaced in any way.



3. The postage stamp image components (e.g. artist's name, copyright symbol, Jersey Post Limited's name, year and printer's name) may not be altered, removed or replaced in any way.



4. The postage stamp image may be reproduced in full colour or black and white. However, if the postage stamp image is reproduced in colour, a small thin cancel line of contrasting colour must run through the value on the postage stamp.



5. The postage stamp image may not be covered or obscured by another illustration or text. However, if a number of Jersey Post stamps (but no other postal administration's stamps) are to be reproduced in a montage, some overlap is acceptable.
6. You may not reproduce Jersey Post stamps together with the stamps of another postal administration without the specific prior written consent of Jersey Post.
7. The postage stamp image may be reproduced, in proportion, in black and white at any size providing that the quality of the image is not impaired.
8. If the postage stamp image is to be reproduced in colour it must be shown, in proportion, either smaller or larger than actual size but the quality of the image must not be impaired.
9. The postage stamp image may be reproduced providing that the reputation of Jersey Post, the postage stamp artist/photographer or the postage stamp printer is not compromised.
10. "© Jersey Post Limited" or "Copyright Jersey Post Limited" must appear next to the image(s) or within the text of the related article.
11. The published use of the postage stamp images may be subject to an embargo which must be adhered to. Jersey Post will advise you in this situation. Use of a stamp prior to the release date on any embargo will be treated as a breach of copyright.

Any breach of the above conditions will result in the involvement of Jersey Post's Legal and Compliance team for further investigation and possible further action.
